

Scientists Hear Account Of Far-Flung War Work

An intimate picture of the far-flung wartime activities of the Christian Science church was given to Klamath Falls representatives who attended a meeting in Portland Monday night.

Spencer E. Holland, manager of the London branch of the church in Boston, spoke to the group about the church's war relief program in Europe. Holland has been in charge of the Christian Science war relief and welfare work in the British zone of operations in Europe.

It was brought out that from June 1, 1940, to December 31, 1945, the Christian Science church expended for wartime activities considerably more than \$8,000,000, including camp welfare work and relief in occupied countries, in Russia, and in the United Kingdom. This figure does not include cost of labor for packing, knitting and other services done by thousands of volunteer Christian Science workers.

More than \$4,250,000 worth of clothing was shipped by the Christian Science war relief to many countries ravaged by war, including the forwarding of packages of food to areas in need.
