

# Police Officer Selected As 'Canyon Passage Man'

"The Man from Canyon Passage" is Officer Bud Adkins of the Klamath Falls police department. Those participating in the manhunt which is scheduled to get under way Saturday, are urged to "mark well" the face on Page 1 of this issue as it means \$150 to the person who succeeds in nabbing Adkins on the day of the hunt.

Named by Lloyd Lamb of the Klamath Theatres and Graham Kinsbury of Universal Pictures as the \$150 fugitive, Adkins will attempt to elude pursuers during the all-Klamath county mounted posse search in the vicinity around Klamath Falls. If the law enforcement official is successful, the Klamath Falls Police Beneficiary association's fund will be richer by \$150, but if he is apprehended the cash will go to the hunter who catches and tells him "You are 'The Man from Canyon Passage'." The hunt will officially start at 1 p. m. in front of the Esquire theatre on Saturday.

The posse is open to any mounted rider, man or woman, in Klamath county between the ages of 18 and 80. The quarry will have an hour's start on his pursuers and will not know until 12 p. m. on Saturday which of three areas is to be designated as the hunting ground. The posse will be released at 2 p. m. and if the fugitive remains unapprehended until 5 p. m. and reaches the area lying between Main and High street, from 5th to 9th streets, he will be declared "safe." The boundary precaution is planned to preclude the possibility of posse mem-

# Tax Assessors Draw Criticism

SALEM, July 16 (AP)—County assessors are not increasing the assessed value of county property in proportion to the rise in real estate values, the state tax commission said today in disclosing the 1946 ratios of assessed valuation to true value.

The ratios were increased in four counties, stayed the same in two counties, and dropped in 30 counties. Jefferson county's ratio of 70 per cent is highest, and Polk's 37 per cent is lowest.

Counties in which ratios were increased from last year and the 1946 ratios are: Clackamas 60 per cent, up 12 per cent; Lincoln 62, up 7; Marion 44, up 2; and Union 54, up 1.

The following counties are down 1 per cent from last year: Baker 59, Benton 49, Coos 60, Crook 50, Deschutes 40, Douglas 59, Grant 54, Jefferson 70, Josephine 54, Lake 60, Linn 48, Morrow 66, Multnomah 56, Polk 37, Tillamook 49, Umatilla 61, Wasco 52, Washington 48, Yamhill 48.

The following counties have ratios down 2 per cent from last year: Clatsop 48, Columbia 48, Harney 65, Hood River 55, Jackson 60, Klamath 38, Lane 48, Malheur 39, Sherman 63, Wheeler 55.

Gilliam county's ratio of 62 per cent is down 38 per cent from 1945.

# Army Accepts All-American

EUGENE, July 16 (AP)—Michael M. Mikulak, former all-American fulback at the University of Oregon and all-National league selection at the same position with the Chicago Cardinals, was sworn in here yesterday as a first lieutenant in the regular army. He was sworn in as an infantryman and assigned to the corps of military police, according to Lt. Robert R. Fleming of the local recruiting staff.

Mikulak, who returned here as backfield coach after several seasons in the pro ranks, enlisted in the army prior to the war and after some four years of service, three overseas with the military police, returned here this summer as backfield coach under Head Coach Tex Oliver. He expects to receive orders within the next two weeks.

Oliver said that he anticipated the action and that the former lieutenant colonel would have to be replaced. The athletic department has someone in mind, but no announcement will be made until the athletic board acts.
