

Theatre Operator Flies To Klamath



Using facilities of the Klamath Falls airport, George M. Mann, owner and general manager of the theatre circuit bearing his name, arrived at mid-afternoon Monday from San Francisco in his Howard five-place ship. Accompanying Mann were his wife, Neva, for whom the plane was named, Hal Honore, assistant general manager of the Mann circuit, and Cliff Morris, engineer for the circuit and pilot of the plane. The "Neva" was custom-built for Screen Star Wallace Beery and has since been completely rebuilt for Mr. and Mrs. Mann. The ship has the latest Pratt-Whitney 450-horsepower motor, two-way radio communicative system, and makes it possible for home office executives of the Mann organization to travel from San Francisco to Klamath Falls in approximately two hours.

Rent Control Measure Introduced At Salem

SALEM, July 16 (AP)—The Salem city council last night took a first step toward establishing city rent control, introducing a measure to set up a five-man fair rent committee with a full-time executive secretary. Council members said they might enact the bill August 5. The measure was introduced under a city charter provision permitting the city to regulate and license trades and businesses. The city had rent control during the war. The bill would permit appeals to municipal court from decisions of the board.
