Tariff Cuts Given Study

WASHINGTON, July 18 (AP)—Tariff cutting took the top spot today on this country's program for expanding global trade.

At a quick follow-up to the \$3,750,000,000 loan to Britain, some 30 or more inter-departmental committees are at work within the government drafting lists of thousands of commodities on which lower import duties will be considered.

Under authority of the 1934 trade agreement act renewed last year, the administration can slash present tariffs as much as 50 per cent, provided American industries are not jeopardized by the cuts.

These reductions, however, will be made applicable only to countries willing to offer comparable concessions.

But whereas earlier trade agreements were negotiated separately with individual nations, present plans call for a 16-nation conference to write a single compact covering not only tariff duties but other trade barriers in the form of quotas, preferences and subsidies.

Preparations for this conference are regarded by officials here as the beginning of the second stage in long-range American plans to raise international living standard by freeing and expanding commerce.

The first step was the British loan, finally approved only this week after nearly a year of negotiation and congressional debate. The initial advance under the loan—a \$300,000,000 item—was scheduled to be made available today through the Federal Reserve bank of New York.

One of the principal factors involved in the loan was that with an ample supply of dollars Great Britain would be able to support the American free trade program.

Hence officials here are counting on the trade conference early next year to bring early relaxation and ultimate abolishment of British Empire trade preferences. This system has made it more economical for members of the empire to trade among themselves rather than with outsiders.

Federal Pay Boost Sought

WASHINGTON, July 18 (AP)—Rep. Neely (D-WVa) today introduced legislation to boost salaries of post office and federal workers \$500 yearly "to meet the rising cost of living occasioned by the cessation of federal price controls."

Both groups of workers recently received a \$400 yearly boost, although the nation's 430,000 postal employees are currently going without any pay at all as the result of a legislative jam. The \$1,600,000,000 post office-treasury appropriation bill, carrying postal payroll funds, is snagged in a senate-house conference committee by a disagreement over the price to be fixed for sale of government-owned silver.

Post office officials said they are "hopeful" of an early agreement which would permit prompt approval of the bill. The department's employees were scheduled to be paid Tuesday and Wednesday.

Hotel Flames Rout Guests

SALT LAKE CITY, July 18 (AP)—Dozens of the more than 200 guests of the Wilson hotel in downtown Salt Lake City fled to the street in their nightclothes early today when fire broke out in the basement.

Assistant Fire Chief Willis Smith said the blaze was extinguished within a few minutes. He estimated damage to the building at \$2000, plus considerable loss to furnishings due to smoke.

Many of the guests, awakened by a bellboy, hurried down the stairs; some tied bed sheets together and lowered themselves to the ground; at least three, including one woman, climbed down a ladder attached to the hotel's sign, and firemen carried several down ladders from the upper floor of the five-story building.

Smith said a cigarette, carelessly thrown in a storage room, started the fire.
