

Texas Clergyman Picked For First Baptist Post

The Rev. Louis R. Adams of Loop, Tex., has been named to the position of assistant pastor and educational director of the First Baptist church, 414 N. 8th. He is expected to arrive in Klamath Falls September 1.

Coming from Colorado eight years ago, the Rev. Adams was licensed by the Klamath Falls church to preach the gospel. He then went to Texas where he enrolled in Howard Payne college. After his graduation he filled the pulpit at Garden City and Loop, Tex.

The local church plans to begin an intensive visitation, educational and enlistment program, according to the Rev. C. C. Brown. He states that the call of the Rev. Adams is one of the major steps to develop the church program. Plans are also under consideration to enlarge the facilities of the departments while plans for the new building on Esplanade are materializing.

SEATTLE, July 19 (AP)—Wreckage of a plane sighted on Saddle mountain and thought to be that of missing Sidney Matz, New York business executive, was identified last night by army fliers as a single engine navy plane.

Such a plane has been missing since last September.

Most promising clue in the search for the Matz plane was a report that a craft resembling it was seen in a haze near Pyak, east of Snoqualmie pass, the morning of July 8, when Matz disappeared on an Ellensburg-Seattle flight.

PORTLAND, Ore., July 19 (AP)—Fewer jobless are tramping this region's streets right now, the U. S. employment service reported today.

Unemployed, numbering 40,000 in May, dropped to 23,500 in June in this metropolitan

area—Multnomah, Washington and Columbia counties. Four thousand jobless are women, 6300 are veterans.

The USES attributed the improved situation to seasonal work, and to the fact that about 6000 women and oldsters retired.
