Corn was off more than two cents a bushel in oats and while the July contract in oats, in which trading ended today was up around two cents, deferred deliveries were off as much as three cents.

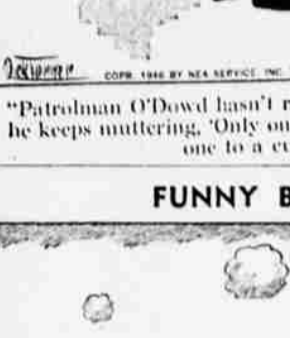
