chest last night voted to include the new YMCA program in this year's chest budget.

The YMCA goes in with a starting budget of \$7000 sufficient to employ a secretary and inaugurate the program here, but with no provision yet for physical facilities.

The chest directors took final

action last night on all budget matters, and it appears the total to be raised in the first Klamath community chest campaign will be around \$50,000.

In addition to accepting the YMCA as a participating organization, the directors voted to include the Oregon chest. Benefiting agencies in the latter unit include the various child welfare institutions to which many Klamath children go. The USO is also included in the Oregon chest.

The chest campaign will be staged in the fall. Elton Thompson is drive director and is already lining up his organization. Chairman of the board is Arnold Gralapp.

Paul Lee, chairman of the YMCA advisory committee, appeared before the board to ask for inclusion of the Y in the year's chest. He said that the plan to be followed here, with a secretary inaugurating the program even though a building has not been established, has proved successful elsewhere and appears the logical way of starting a Y in Klamath Falls.

He emphasized that the Y work will be made county-wide, with activities at such places as Chilquin, Merrill, Malin and other county points.

The exact amount of the Oregon chest budget was not certain, but it is believed it will be around \$13,000. Harold Hendrickson explained the work done by the various agencies benefiting from the Oregon chest, and it was emphasized that many local children have been and will be aided by these agencies.

KFLW To Give Air Inaugural

Injured Youth Said Improved

Larry Anderson, 12-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. George Anderson of Portland, who was seriously injured from being dragged by a horse Tuesday, is showing some improvement and responding to medical treatment, according to hospital attendants and his physician.

In addition to severe gravel burns, lacerations, a punctured lung and other injuries, latest X-rays show that the boy is suffering from a fractured skull. Klamath Valley hospital attendants say that he rested fairly well last night.

Larry was dragged about a quarter of a mile by a horse on the Dan Liskey Swan lake range Tuesday. The boy was spending the summer with the Liskeys.

Mrs. George McMillan, 27, who accidentally shot herself Tuesday with a .22 rifle, is "doing quite well," according to Hillside hospital attendants. Mrs. McMillan has wounds where the bullet entered and left her body on the upper left side of her chest. The accident occurred at Sand Point, some 20 miles north of Klamath Agency on the Bend highway.

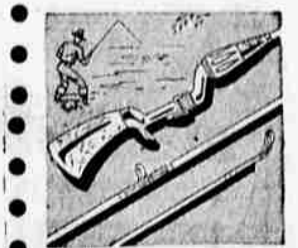
