

Guard Plans For Western States Told

SAN FRANCISCO, July 23 (AP)—National guard representatives assembled here from eight western states were told yesterday that guard divisions will be assigned as nearly as possible to the same areas as before the war and that approximately 80,000 ground troops and 8,500 airmen would be authorized for units in the sixth army area.

Major Gen. Butler B. Miltenberger, after declaring that the Pacific coast defense system may well "go 2,000 to 3,000 miles seaward" and include rockets and flying missiles, cited the following apportionments of guard strength:

Washington — 12,000 ground troops and 700 airmen; Oregon — 11,000 ground and 1,100 air as well as base elements of California's 40th infantry division; Idaho 5,000 ground and 350 air; Montana 3,700 ground and 350 air.

The 41st division will be stationed in Washington, Oregon and Idaho with California and Oregon getting the 50th armored.

Safety Survey Lists Injuries

Oregon farm residents and workers on 9200 farms covered by the industrial accident commission suffered 1719 accidents in 1945, of which 10 were fatal. These figures, compiled by J. B. Avison, statistician for the commission, were released in connection with the third annual National Farm Safety week, July 21 to 27.

While these are doublets; the larger farms of the state, it is not certain whether the accidents per farm on the total of some 64,000 farms of Oregon would be greater or fewer. Applying the ratio would give approximately 12,000 total farm accidents and 70 fatalities for the last year in this state.

Of the farm accidents reported to the Oregon commission, the highest percentage consists of sprains, cuts and bruises at 44 per cent, followed by cuts and lacerations at 30 per cent. Fractures rate third with 12 per cent.

Officer Convicted In Typist Assault

BOSTON, July 25 (AP)—Lieut. Thomas Farrell was convicted by a Suffolk superior court jury today on three counts of assault with a razor blade on Miss Helen Stavrou, 16-year-old typist.

Farrell, veteran of 35 air missions in the Pacific, showed no outward emotion as the verdict was announced.

He had appeared confident of acquittal and, while waiting for the jury to come back, he told newsmen he hoped to spend a vacation at Hampton beach.

New construction applications include: \$76,000 sales and service building at Pendleton by Braden-Bell Tractor and Equipment company; \$52,400 warehouse at Sa-

lem by Lester DeLapp; \$20,000 restaurant at Eugene by Otis Clingman.
