

# New Lumber Mill To Open In Coast Range Foothills

Harold R. Crane, for many years manager of the Crane Mills at Bly, plans to open a new enterprise, the Crane Lumber company, at Paskenta, Calif., sometime around August 5 or 6. Paskenta is 23 miles west of Corning in the coast range foothills. The mill at Paskenta has been under construction since early

March, according to Crane, and although work is not completed the first logs will go through on schedule about August 8.

Walter Beane, president of the Klamath Iron works, and Robert Grimmett of the Pine Logging company are associated with Crane in the three-quarter million dollar project.

Timber for the mill will come from the virgin areas to the west of Paskenta in the mountains, the logging being done by the firm of Hamaker-Heild. Some 20 miles of logging road has been constructed to haul logs, and a crew of 80 men will be in the woods.

Hamaker-Heild formerly logged in the Lakeview area and more recently for the Medford corporation. The mill will operate almost entirely from electricity and will have a capacity of 75,000 board feet per day.

Crane sold Crane Mills at Bly to the Spangler Lumber company, a Klamath concern, which is operating there. Crane is still interested, however, in logging operations in east Klamath county.

A new totalisator machine will be added, as well as an electric odds board to be placed in the infield.

The fair opens Labor Day and will last a week. The electric starting gate will be used again, and workmen will begin soon to fence the fair's half-mile track.

The first formal entry for the fair's livestock show arrived today. Mrs. P. V. Glaspie, Milner, B. C., entered 17 cattle, while E. C. Milward, Aldergrove, B. C., entered two Jersey cattle.

B. F. Ricketts, Zanesville, Ohio, was named judge of the fair's poultry show.

# Portland CPA Okays \$270,000 Of Work
