

# Sugar Beet Crops Good At Tulelake

TULELAKE, July 26—Sugar beets in this area are being blocked and thinned, principally by Mexicans from the Sacramento valley. There are no Mexican nationals here at the present time.

Between 700 and 800 acres were planted to beets this spring and the crop looks good. All acreages are contracted to the Spreckles company and growers will realize \$14.50 per ton for 16 per cent sugar content.

The crop will be harvested with specially built machines brought here from other beet growing districts that will lift, top and load in one operation. It is expected that 10 machines will operate during the harvest season. Each machine can handle 60 tons of beets per day. The crop will be shipped to a refinery at Woodland.

# Special Cachet To Mark First Air Mail Letters

The first airmail letters to leave Klamath Falls on August 1, the day United Air Lines flights start, will bear a special cachet, marking them for that occasion. The cachet is a small rubber stamp, produced by the post office department in Washington, D. C., depicting the Upper lake with Mt. Pitt in the background and bearing the words "Klamath Falls, U. S. airmail, first flight."

The cachet will be used only on letters leaving by the first planes, one north and one south. Persons who wish to send out letters bearing this cachet are advised to send them in early, as the post office here has to mark them and stamp them prior to loading them aboard the plane. Letters should be addressed and stamped and then enclosed in another envelope. The cover will be addressed to the postmaster, Klamath Falls, and stamped. Inside the cover include your letter and a note asking the postmaster to hold this letter for the first plane leaving Klamath Falls on August 1.

Letters may be addressed to yourself, at the Klamath Falls address, in which case they will be sent to Portland, going north, or Oakland on the southern route, and then returned by the first plane from either of those terminals. There is no limit to the number of letters that one person may send.

Collectors who wish to have letters back-stamped should send them to the postmaster under cover, with a request that they be dropped at the first point on the route. In this case it will be Salem to the north and Oakland to the south. Letters sent in this manner must be addressed to the sender at General Delivery at Salem or Oakland, and must be sent

for by the person who mailed them. The letter thus marked will be marked on the back, with the time of arrival at the terminal. Closing time for airmail on August 1 will be 8:30, although a slightly later date is expected in the future.

Burt Hawkins, Klamath postmaster, reminds the users of airmail that the domestic rate is 8 cents, instead of the old rate of 6 cents. The 6-cent stamp may be used only when the letter is addressed to a serviceman overseas.

Some 1500 letters are already on hand at the post office awaiting the first flight, and a heavy deluge of mail is expected within the next few days. Estimates by post office officials tend to show that there will be a 100 per cent increase in the use of airmail now that the airlines go through here. An estimated average of 150 pounds of airmail daily will pass through this office, with each letter weighing an average of one-half ounce.

# Lakeview To Take Over Naval Airfield Sunday

The naval airfield at Lakeview will be formally presented to the city on an interim permit Sunday, when Lt. Cmd. Fitzpatrick, of the Klamath air station, will turn over the port to Mayor Lyle North, of Lakeview.

A two-day celebration has been planned for the event, with Saturday designated as Klamath day. Weather permitting, approximately 20 planes will fly from Klamath Falls to attend the show Saturday, leaving here at 1 in the afternoon and arriving there around 2 o'clock. Pamphlets advertising both the centennial and Klamath Air Day will be dropped by the flyers as they go over Lakeview.

The program at Lakeview for Saturday will consist mainly of registering visiting flyers. Planes are expected from all over the state, as well as from California and Colorado. A dance will be held in the hangar Saturday night, with music furnished by Ray Williams and his orchestra.

Sunday's program will start at 9 a. m., with a ground demonstration of new planes by dealers, followed by a model plane contest at 10:30. The model contest will be sponsored by the Lake County Model club, and will feature power models only.

At 12 noon rides will be given to the winners of the three prizes at Saturday night's dance, each good for a free ride. A landing and take off demonstration by visiting pilots will be held at 1:15 and 2 o'clock will see the formal opening ceremonies, KFLW, Klamath Falls, will broadcast the opening speeches and presentation from 2 to 2:30. Following the presentation dignitaries will be presented, including Leo G. Devaney, NAA member and director of the state board of aeronautics.

An air show, featuring races, stunt flying and tricks will go on from 2:30 till 4:30, climaxed by a novel parachute jump at the close of the show. Jack Briscoe of Lakeview, is general chairman of the occasion, and has made all arrangements.

Officials from Klamath attending the Saturday show at Lakeview will include among others, John Houston, Marshall Cornett and Phil Hitchcock.
