Tulelake Men Form Chamber

TULELAKE, July 26—Tulelake businessmen, called together by Mayor Ralph Fausett Wednesday night, organized a new chamber of commerce, adopted by-laws and a constitution and elected officers and directors. Fausett acted as temporary chairman, with Charles Rose in the chair as temporary secretary. Don Potter of the Potter Equipment company will serve the chamber as president for the first year; Dave Bridge, manager of the Tulelake Cold Storage plant, will serve as first vice president, and Bruce Brickell of the Fairway market will serve as second vice president. The secretary-treasurer will be appointed. The above officers with Don Webster, Fred and White meat market; Harry Renbarger, electrician; Clifton Hines, manager of the Tulelake Associated Oil, and Ray Moresco, co-owner of the Tulelake Sportsman's hotel, will function as the board of directors.

Between 30 and 40 prospective members have signified interest in the new chamber.

Sunday, July 28, it was announced today by the California Oregon Power company. Off duty Pvt. Bravo replaces his helmet liner with a service cap with visor and removes his leather shoulder strap and pistol which every man, except officers and bandmen, carry in the Constabulary.
