Tough Test For Snapp

Youthful Spencer Holds Good Tacoma Ring Record
Promoter Mack Lillard, who has seen Kayo Mel Spencer in action, thinks the colored Tacoma lightweight will prove a real acid test for the local ring champ in their main event bout tomorrow night at the armory.

Spencer is just 20 years old, is six feet tall and weighs 175. He has a long reach and has won five of six recent bouts by knockouts. The statistics put him just about of equal size with his opponent, Ural Snapp, who also is a six-footer and rangy.

Snapp has fought two bouts since he came out of the army, outpointing Billy Sunday and knocking out Johnny Peters, and will be the intense favorite of the crowd to do likewise with Spencer. Snapp is not only a very popular Klamath county boy, he is an excellent boxer with a good punch, so the favoritism the crowd will show him when he comes into the ring tomorrow night will not be purely sentimental.

Another Fiver
The bout will be five rounds. In the other five, Johnny Jones of the Southern Pacific will meet PFC Len Allen of the Marine Barracks in a middleweight scrap.

Jones, well-built, stocky left-hander, has shown three times here and improved with each fight. His first fight went to a three-hour technical for Billy Sunday, principally because Jones failed to guard his chin, but he has made no such mistake in later bouts.

Very little is known about the marine who will fight Jones except that he is said to be one of the most promising leather-neck leatherpushers who have been working out in the big bar-acks gymnasium, a gym that turned out some very good fighters while the military installation was running full blast.

Quartet of Prelims
In addition to the Snapp-Spencer headliner and the Jones-Allen tiff, four prelims of four rounds each are on the card for tomorrow.

Pair Of AL Hurlers Head For 30 Wins

Unless Cleveland's Bobby Feller or Detroit's Hal Newhouser hits an unexpected decline, there appears a good chance today that the American league will furnish two 30-game winners this season.

Not since 1912 when the immortal Walter Johnson and Smokey Joe Wood reached the 30-victory mark did two great pitchers come along with such peerless parallel performances.

Following on the heels of Newhouser, who became the majors' first pitcher to win 20 games Saturday, Feller racked up his 19th triumph yesterday by shutting out the Washington Senators 2-0 in the opener of a doubleheader. The Indians also won the nightcap 7-4 to advance

within three games of the fourth place Nationals.

Hard-luck Dizzy Trout went down to his third straight shutout defeat as Jesse Flores scattered seven Bengal bingles in pitching the A's to a 2-0 win in the opener, Frank (Stubby) Overmire spaced seven hits to defeat the Mackmen in the nightcap 6-2.

Sox Keep Lead
The pace-setting Boston Red Sox maintained their 11-game lead over the New York Yankees by gaining an even split with the St. Louis Browns. After Denny Galehouse has stopped them 3-2 in the first game, the Sox stripped six St. Louis chucks for 13 hits and an 11-4 triumph in the afterpiece.

The Yankees also had to come from behind to break even with Chicago. Held to six hits in the opener by Johnny Rigney who blanked them 2-0, the New Yorkers hopped on Ralph Hamner and two successors for 11 hits and an easy 7-1 win.

The second-place St. Louis Cardinals narrowed Brooklyn's National league leading margin to a game and a half by blanking the Boston Braves 2-0 while the Dodgers were being humbled by Pittsburgh's Pirates 7-3.

Cubs Advance
The third place Chicago Cubs advanced to within six and a half games of first place by sweeping both ends of a twin bill from the Philadelphia Phillies 11-3 and 3-1. A seven-run first frame helped Hank Borowy, returning to the mound after being knocked off the hill Saturday, to his fifth success.

Despite a pair of home runs by the Giants' Johnny Mize, which raised his league leading total to 22, the Cincinnati Reds downed the New Yorkers twice, 8-3 and 5-4.

WI Baseball Scores High
