Army To Recall Reserves For Special Assignments

The war department has announced the increase in quotas for recall to active duty, of 1000 national guard and reserve officers of all grades for service with the intelligence division, 35 for service with foreign liquidation commission, and 50 additional for service with finance department.

Bus Crash Toll Reaches Five

WHITE SALMON, Wash., July 29 (AP)—Merle Nelson, Yakima, driver of a Washington motor coach wrecked near here Saturday, died in the Hood River hospital today, bringing the death toll to five.

Nelson had never recovered consciousness since the collision with a heavy furniture van, which ripped open the side of the loaded bus and killed three women outright. A fourth died a few hours later.

Six bus passengers remained in the Hood River hospital today, where their condition was described "as good as can be expected."

Investigators reported the eastbound bus and a furniture van driven by Leonard M. Paquin, Yakima, sideswiped on a narrow curve of the Evergreen highway at Loch lake. The bus swerved into the ditch, its side ripped open, and then moved across the highway and struck a car. The truck driver, his wife and daughter, were not hurt seriously.

Improved Spud Harvester Out

NEW YORK, July 29 (AP)—New Holland Machine Co. announced today quantity production has started on a new potato harvester which combined all harvesting operations in a single machine.

Tests of the new harvester, the company said, show a cut of less than one-third of the cost of conventional methods of potato harvesting.

Ralph Hertzler, young farmer of Lancaster county, Pa., invented and perfected the mechanism that brings the tubers from the ground, cleans them of loose dirt and bags them for transport.

First units of the harvester will be available for use in this year's potato crop, the company said.

Experimental operation, it was added, indicate the machine is suited for harvesting other important tuberous products, including onions and sugar beets.

Old Soldier Dead After Long Career

SEATTLE, July 29 (AP)—Samuel Pittson, 86-year-old retired soldier, was to be buried today. He died Saturday.

Pittson's military career began as a private in the British army during the Egyptian war of 1882. He fought with the United States forces against the Cheyenne and Sioux Indians in the early 1890's and served in Cuba and the Philippines during the Spanish-American war. He was retired in 1914.

vacancies available to officers who have gone on inactive duty or terminal leave but who desire further active duty. War department representatives indicated that this number may be increased in the near future.

Although the war department is authorized to recall officers to active duty without their consent during the emergency it is desired to fill these vacancies with volunteers. Accordingly, quotas have been established to meet the needs of each of the branches of service whose personnel problems have been made acute by the rapid demobilization of the army.

Volunteers under this program may elect to serve for an unlimited length of time or for a 12, 18, or 24 month period. The war department, recognizing that such volunteer officers should have some degree of assurance that their services will be utilized for the entire period for which they volunteer, plans for this policy to remain in effect until the army obtains a permanent postwar status. At present, the war department cannot foresee any circumstances which would cause separation of officers prior to the completion of their volunteer period.

Officers desiring to volunteer for return to active duty must apply in writing to the adjutant general, war department, Washington 25, D. C., and must meet the physical standards for overseas service. Application forms may be obtained at any army installation, army recruiting station, or officers' reserve corps headquarters. In the event an officer on inactive status, desiring active duty, does not have a reserve or national guard commission, he may apply for active duty providing he has applied for a reserve commission, qualified applicants may be recalled pending action on application in the officers' reserve corps. However, non-acceptance within 10 days of the appointment in the officers' reserve corps, when tendered, will be cause for relief from active duty.

Although officers returning to duty from an inactive status are eligible for overseas assignment, recall to active duty does not necessarily mean the officer will immediately be assigned overseas. Credit will be given for previous overseas service in the same manner as for officers who have remained on active duty. It is pointed out that dependents are authorized in many overseas stations and that choice of theater is given due consideration.

Home Freezing Advice Given

All berries, with the exception of strawberries, can be fresh frozen without sugar, according to Mrs. Winnifred K. Gillen, home demonstration agent. Berries should be washed, drained, put in containers, sealed and frozen. When berries are to be used they can be sprinkled slightly with sugar just before they are served, and served just as the homemaker would fresh berries, she said.

If the homemaker prefers to use sugar, Mrs. Gillen advised that not more than one-fourth cup should be used per pint. In fixing raspberries, pack the berries in layers, sprinkling a little sugar between each layer. When the container is filled and sealed it should be turned around several times so that berries will be coated.

Strawberries, though they can be frozen without sugar, Mrs. Gillen reports that berries are more successful if sugar is used. Detailed information and free bulletins on home freezing can be obtained at the home extension office in the post office.
