Due to conditions beyond our control, such as construction on South 6th, the extension of certain runs, etc., we are forced to inaugurate a new schedule which we feel sure will be more satisfactory to the public. Beginning August 1st the Shasta Way bus will leave town on the hour only, and will turn around at Madison and South 6th and return via Shasta Way. Therefore, those people on South 6th who have been riding the hourly Shasta Way bus will ride the South 6th and Altamont-Summers Lane buses.

The South 6th bus will leave town at 10 of the hour and all trips will continue around Hope and Homedale, except Sundays and Holidays.

The Altamont-Summers Lane bus will leave :30 after the even hours and :30 after the odd hours throughout the day, and all trips will continue around Summers Lane except Sundays and Holidays.

THE FOLLOWING SCHEDULE ONLY WILL BE EFFECTIVE ON SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS, and will include Shasta Way, South 6th, and Altamont.
