

Tulelake Expects Influx Of Migrant Farm Hands

TULELAKE, July 31—Early registrations of white migrant workers here indicate a decided increase in the number that can be anticipated for the harvest season, it was announced Tuesday by Clifford Woods, manager of the Tulelake Growers. There probably will be a 50 per cent cut in the number of Mexican nationals to be brought into the area.

Farmers are rapidly approaching the solution to the housing problem for transient labor that has hampered the handling of workers here in past years. Army barracks at former Camp Tulelake are being remodeled to be used this fall and beds and stoves will be provided. Partitions are being put in to accommodate family groups and for the first time a strictly modern camp can be maintained.

Hot water will be available and there will be showers and a strict sanitation program. The camp will be under charge of a manager and those using the quarters will pay a small weekly fee. The old camp site on the highway near here will be abandoned.

Growers have been assessed \$1 per acre on row crops and 10 cents per acre on all other crops to finance the housing program. The maximum wage rate for agricultural labor prior to the harvest season as set by the war food administration remains the same this season as last, with general farm labor getting \$1

per hour when no housing or other prerequisites are furnished on \$200 per month plus housing and other prerequisites exclusive of board.

Harvesters will get 5 cents per half sacks of 60 pounds for picking potatoes; \$1.25 per hour for all other potato harvest labor; \$1.25 per hour for hay stackers and all other hay harvest labor \$1 per hour; header tender for grain, \$8 per day and board; jigger and cartman, \$9 per day and board; sack sewers, \$10 per day and board; truck drivers, \$10 per day and board; machine men (combine or separator) operator, \$12 per day and board; caterpillar drivers (single combine) \$9 per day and board; caterpillar drivers (two or more combines), \$10 per day and board; bucking sacks, \$10 per day and board.

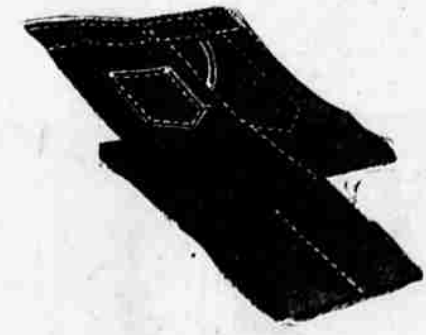

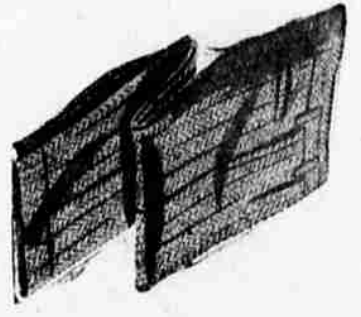
