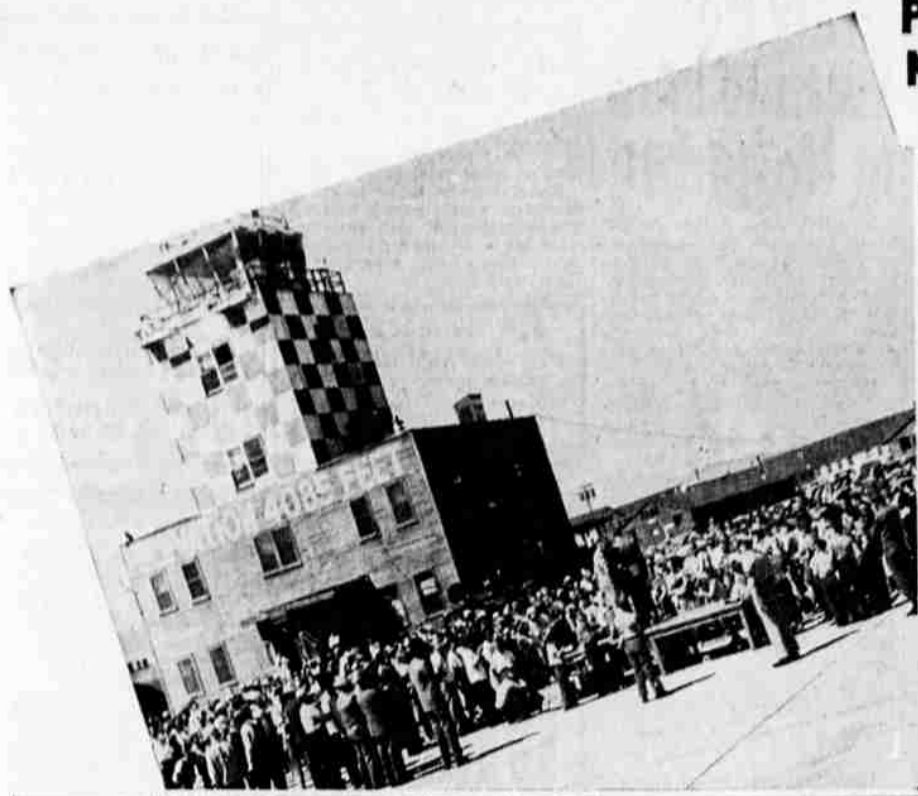


Photographic Review Of First Mainline Flight Celebration
