Illinois Doctor Opposes Summer Tonsil Removal

SEATTLE, Aug. 8 (AP)—Dr. Sandor Horwitz, Illinois superintendent of public health for the district around Peoria, disapproved here yesterday that Illinois doctors are developing a tendency to avoid performance of tonsillectomies between July and November.

The doctor, here to visit a nephew, Dr. Isidore Kahan, rabbi of Ezra Bessaroth congregation, said the tendency developed through inability to determine the manner in which the virus of polio enters the body, and a wish to avoid leaving "raw spots" in the throat for the virus to enter, if it does enter that way.

Heretofore the summer season has been regarded as best for tonsillectomies because it is the one in which there is the lowest rate of upper respiratory infections and streptococcal manifestations, Dr. Horwitz said.
