WASHINGTON, Aug. 7 (AP)—President Truman signed today bills providing for commemorative coins for Iowa's statehood. The other authorizes five million 50-cent pieces in honor of the late Booker T. Washington, negro leader and educator.

The coins will be sold for \$1 each to help establish a birthplace memorial to Washington at Rocky Mount, Va.
