

Six Die As Army Planes Crash In Mid-Air Over Packed Fair Grandstand

GREAT FALLS, Mont., Aug. 10 (AP)—Army authorities today were engaged in the grim task of completing identification of six persons killed when two B-26 attack bombers collided during an air show Friday before 20,000 horrified spectators at the North Montana state fair.

Two of the dead, killed when a plane hurtled into a race horse barn, were identified as Lt. Arthur P. Lettier, Cleveland, Ohio and Dorothy Mae Szabo of B. W. Mont., a Montana State university student.

An investigating panel

from the Great Falls air base launched an inquiry into the accident.

Two persons in the vicinity of the horse barn when the plane struck were treated for shock and burns. They are Herbert Taylor, 48, Payette, Idaho, burns on arms and legs and Joseph Bouman, Jordan, Mont., shock.

Boy Hurt
Edward P. Murphy, 6, son of Judith Basin County Attorney Paul Murphy, seated in a car parked near the barn, was treated for lacerations and severe head injuries.

Eight automobiles parked by the structure were demolished as the plane ripped through Limby timber.

Three of the twin-engine medium bombers were roaring low over a grandstand packed with fairgoers when, eye witnesses said, a wing from one of the airplanes apparently sheared off the tail of the other.

One of the planes burst into flame and zoomed into the horse barn, filled with race horses. The other sped crazily on, flaming as it dug into the earth a mile away.

Horses Killed
The barn flared and the screams of burning horses brought near panic to the crowd, averted by army and civilian personnel. Seven of the animals perished in the flames and two others were so badly injured they were destroyed.

Army officers said the attack bombers usually carry a pilot and two crewmen but that the planes engaged in the air show carried only a pilot and co-pilot.

Identity of a civilian body taken from the barn was not immediately determined but the Great Falls Tribune said Andy Seaman of Rexburg, Idaho, was believed to have been tending horses when the accident took place. He was reported missing.

The planes were based at the Lake Charles, La., army air base and were flying in air shows under command of Col. Wilson R. Wood, from the Smyrna, Tenn., air base, the Great Falls army air base reported.

The swift planes were an important feature in the European theater and were used as night fighters and medium bombers.

Earl Ziegler, personnel manager for AGA, big Hood River fruit growers' co-operative, said 375 women would be needed to operate the cannery on the Bartlett pear crop starting August 22, and that fewer than half that number had been signed.

TULELAKE, Aug. 10—Frank Bell, pioneer machinist and a builder of farm equipment, will move his business next fall to Klamath Falls. Construction on a pumice tile and concrete building to be located on S. Sixth, three blocks east of the canal bridge, will start next week. The building will have a 65-foot frontage on S. Sixth and will be ready to occupy by Nov. 15.

Bell, who invented and built the first potato elevator and sucker used in this part of the country, has been in business nine years. He operated first on his ranch on the west side which was sold recently to George Heistman, Tulelake. Later he moved his business to its present location on the Hatfield-Aituras highway.

He will employ seven men, among them L. C. Ogden of the Pelican Bay Lumber company who will be shop foreman.

A. B. Cummins, Klamath Falls is the contractor.
