Air Service To Mexico In Prospect

How Klamath Falls and other Pacific coast cities would be linked by a "three-flag international airline" with important industrial and recreational cities of central Mexico through joint operations of United Air Lines and its Mexican subsidiary LAMSA, is shown in exhibits being introduced at a civil aeronautics board hearing opening this week at Albuquerque, N. M.

United is seeking authority to connect its existing Pacific coast route from Vancouver through Klamath Falls and other key Pacific coast cities to San Diego, with LAMSA's route from Mexico City to Nogales, Ariz. Such an operation, United officials point out, would provide new and important air ties for the swift movement of both passengers and cargo between the 32 cities now on United's west coast airway and the 15 cities served by LAMSA (Lineas Aereas Mexicanas, S. A.).

United's exhibits show that the proposed United-LAMSA operation would, for example, place Klamath Falls eight hours from Nogales, 9½ hours from Cananea, 10½ hours from Nuevo Casas Grandes, 12 hours from Chihuahua, 13½ hours from Parral, 14½ hours from Torreon, 14½ hours from San Luis Potosi, 15½ hours from Durango and 18 hours from Mexico City.

"It is evident that the strong commercial ties between this country and Mexico necessitate the development of rapid and convenient lines of communication to the fullest extent," says United's presentation. "The joining of LAMSA and United at Nogales will be an important day in further developing that community of interest."
