

President To Sail Away On 18-Day Yacht Cruise

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15 (AP)—President Truman will leave Washington tomorrow for an 18-day yachting vacation in New England waters.

White House Press Secretary Charles G. Ross disclosed plans for the cruise aboard the presidential yacht, U. S. S. Williamsburg. It will carry the president into the Narragansett bay area and up the east coast of Maine.

It will be the Williamsburg's first voyage under the command of Capt. C. L. Freeman.

Freeman was the executive officer aboard the cruiser Augusta, which carried Mr. Truman to Europe for the "Big Three" conference at Potsdam. The Augusta's skipper, Capt. James H. Foksett, recently became the president's naval aide.

Freeman replaces Capt. John H. Kevers, former commanding officer of the Williamsburg, who recently retired.

Mr. Truman and his White House staff, plus George E. Allen, presidential intimate and reconstruction finance corporation director, will board the Williamsburg at 2:30 p. m. (EST) tomorrow. They will return to Washington in the afternoon of September 2, Labor Day.

It will be Mr. Truman's first

official vacation since he entered the White House upon the death of Franklin D. Roosevelt, April 12, 1945.

Mr. Truman flew to Olympia, Wash., in June, 1945, and spent several days with Gov. Mon C. Waigren. However, that visit was unexpectedly prolonged into sort of a vacation by delay in adjournment of the United Nations conference at San Francisco. The president waited at Olympia until assured of the specific date of its conclusion.

Staff and Friends

Mr. Truman will be accompanied by Ross, Appointment Secretary Matthew J. Connelly, Foksett, Maj. Gen. Harry H. Vaughan, his military aide; Col. Wallace Graham, the president's personal physician; Ted Marks of Kansas City, an old friend, and director of veterans employment in Missouri; and Clark Clifford, his special counsel.

Reconversion Director John R. Steelman will join the party later if his duties here permit.

Ross emphasized that while the president may go ashore a couple of times, he will make no public appearances and no speeches and participate in no ceremonies. He said he would not describe the exact course of the cruise.

New Factory Seeks Permit

Application for a \$25,000 farm machinery manufacturing plant in Klamath Falls has been made by Frank E. Bell of Tulelake, to the civilian production administration. If the application is granted Bell expects to be in operation in his new plant by the middle of November.

The plant will manufacture mostly potato harvesting equipment, including elevators for use in the cellars, a digger and sacking machine, plus individual diggers and sackers and a digger and bulking machine.

The plant will be built on South Sixth street, about three blocks from the canal bridge, and will be in the 4600 block. Equipment now in use in Tulelake will be moved to the new plant, plus some new lathes and shapers.

The move, said Bell, would take about 30 days, during which time the plant will be shut down. A large backlog of orders is on hand, and full production will be maintained after the first of the year for the 1947 crop harvest.
