

New Courses Now Open To GI Scholars

More correspondence school courses have been made available to veterans under the GI bill as the result of contracts recently negotiated by the veterans administration, Zeno Dent, VA representative here, announced.

These new courses include commercial banking, real estate financing, investments, savings management, trusts, commercial art, cartooning and designing, meat cutting, accounting, life underwriting, statistics, federal procedures, reports and agriculture.

While the VA will pay for the courses under the educational provisions of the law, veterans who take the correspondence courses are not eligible for subsistence payments, Dent pointed out.

Listings of the approved correspondence schools are available at the local VA contact office at Klamath Falls which is open from 8 a. m. to 4:30 p. m. every day of the week.

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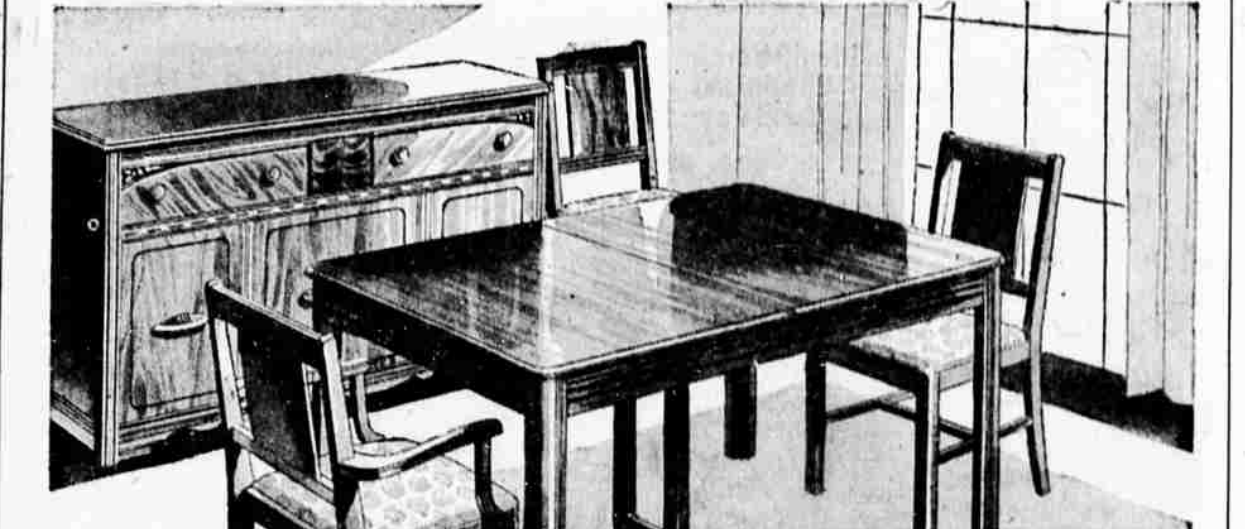
