Inquest Slated In Auto Death

In line with the state police investigation of the car accident resulting in the death of Joseph Pelland of Klamath Falls, early Tuesday, a coroner's inquest will be held at 5:30 this evening.

The accident, which occurred Monday, involved the Pelland car, in which Mrs. Pelland was a passenger, and a car driven by Raymond A. Porterfield of Dorris. The Porterfield car struck the Pelland car in the rear with such an impact as to fatally injure Pelland.

Porterfield's statement to state police reveals that he did not see the other car in time to stop before hitting it, and police say that skid marks on the highway near Merrill, the scene of the accident, show that the brakes on the Porterfield car were not fully applied until after the impact of hitting the other automobile. There is some question as to whether the Pelland car was moving or parked at the time of the crash.

CPA Approves New Gun Shop

Walter F. Phillips, who operates Ralph's gun shop at 1114 Main, has received authorization by the civilian production administration to build a \$4000 building to house his business at 4820 S. 6th.

Phillips said today that construction would start immediately, and the new building would be built of brick or hollow tile, depending on which he could get.

He said that the decision to move out of town was made partly because of the high real estate prices on Main street and also because his shop does not depend on a Main street location for its trade.

Phillips said that his gun work came from all over southern Oregon and northern California, as well as mail order work from several other states. In the new shop he will continue to handle new and used guns, ammunition and accessories and custom gun work.

OREGON CITY, Aug. 15 (AP)—Police were searching the Willamette river here today for the head of the middle-aged woman whose torso was discovered in the river last April.

The hunt was renewed after two tugboat operators found what appeared to be a human scalp entangled in their cable yesterday. The gruesome fragment, with strands of light brown hair, was sent to the state criminology laboratory.

Police ventured the theory that the scalp might be from the dismembered body, and the long missing head might be at the river bottom.

Since the torso's finding, the river has yielded other parts of the woman's body. One was found last month.

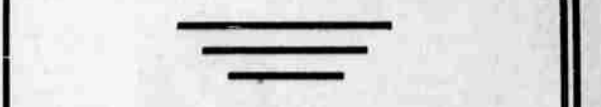

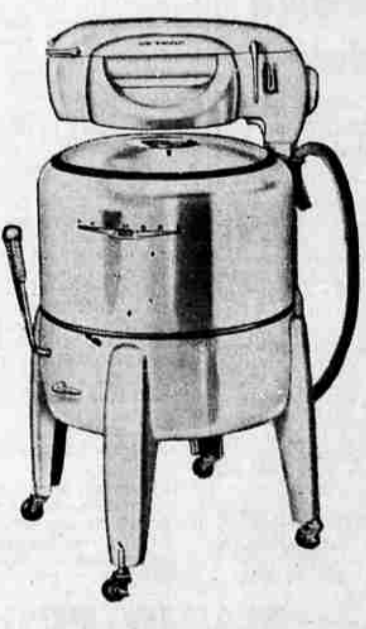
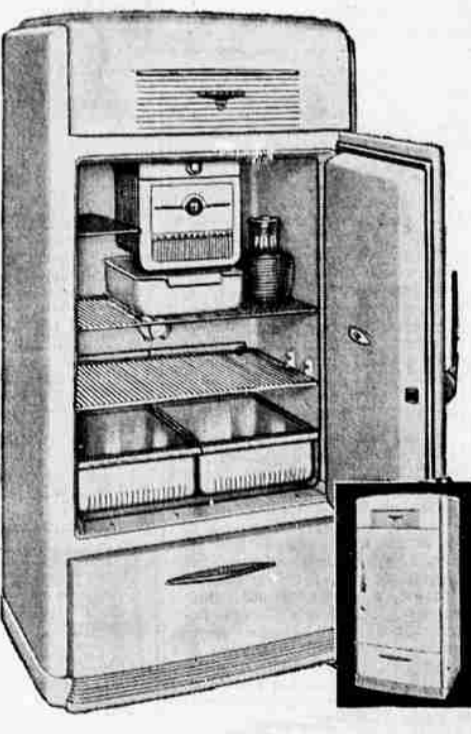
