

Second Degree Murder Is Verdict In Henagin Case

OREGON CITY, Ore., Dec. 9 (AP)—A jury of seven men and five women found Mrs. Luella Henagin, 46, guilty of second degree murder in the slaying of her school superintendent husband, Robert, 41, after his late return from a parent-teacher association meeting.

The jury recommended clemency, but a life sentence is mandatory for second-degree murder. However, application for parole may be had after 7 1/2 years. Judge Earl C. Latourette said he would sentence Mrs. Henagin Wednesday morning.

The verdict was reached yesterday at 1:30 p. m. after almost 11 hours of deliberation, starting late Saturday afternoon but halted that night when the jury reported it was deadlocked in 12 ballots.

The state had asked a first degree murder verdict, but it was evident Saturday night that the jury was divided between second degree and manslaughter. The jury foreman, Carl Hoehnke, asked the court to define the penalties for the two crimes after blurted out that the jury had voted 4 to 8 in its 12 deadlocked ballots. Two women jurors did not sign the second degree murder verdict.

Mrs. Henagin remained calm as the verdict was read by the jury foreman, but was assisted from the courtroom by Sheriff Fred Reakoecker.

The prosecution had accused the woman of deliberately shooting her younger husband the night of October 28 because of jealousy. The defense attorney had argued the husband was the assailant and that the gun discharged as the couple struggled for its possession.

Nazi Doctors Go On Trial

NUERNBERG, Dec. 9 (AP)—Brig. Gen. Telford Taylor demanded today that 22 men and a woman charged with conducting Nazi medical experiments on live victims be condemned as murderers who poisoned the entire German medical profession under Adolph Hitler.

Gen. Taylor opened the trial of high-ranking Nazi doctors in the same court where Hermann Goering, Joachim von Ribbentrop and other Nazi ringleaders were sentenced to death last October. All pleaded innocent.

In sharp, bitter tones, the American prosecutor outlined his case to an all-American court and asserted: "The third reich died of its own poison." The defendants, he said, contributed to that poisoning.

"Talking Frog" Used By Polio Victim In Recovery

PORTLAND, Dec. 9 (AP)—Oregon can boast of a "talking" frog that makes Mark Twain's famous leaping critter a second rate attraction.

Newspaper editors witnessed a demonstration here by Woodburn farmer Matthew Tom Nix of how he manipulated a live frog in his mouth to help regain use of vocal muscles paralyzed when a youngster.

The 34-year-old Nix explained that by carefully feeding the tiny green creature to prevent its growing too large, he was able to use the frog in his cheek to croak out one and two syllable words.
