This year, with "sweets" at a premium, cookie gifts are due to win more appreciation than ever. And here is a recipe for cookies as festive as the season: Peppermint cookies! Call them "Pfeffernus" if you're handy with tongue-twisters.

**PFEFFERNUS**  
4 cups FISHER'S BLEND FLOUR  
2 cups Sugar  
1 teaspoon double-acting Baking Powder  
1 tablespoon Cinnamon  
1 teaspoon Cloves  
1/2 teaspoon Aniseed, ground  
4 Eggs

Sift and measure flour. Sift again with sugar, baking powder, spices. Beat eggs until thick and lemon-colored. Fold sifted dry ingredients into beaten eggs. Grease your hands and form cookie dough into balls about the size of a walnut. Place 1 inch apart on pans lined with waxed paper. Bake at 375° F. 15 minutes. Dust with powdered sugar, if desired. Makes 5 dozen cookies.

Note: These cookies keep well. (If any are left.)
