

Industry Sees Strikes As Result Of Union Demands

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12 (AP)—Industry leaders declared today that the CIO's fresh insistence that wages can be raised without costing prices may lead to another series of serious strikes.

They recalled the CIO had employed the same argument in pressing its initial postwar wage demands in the steel, automobile and other heavy industries last spring but that prices had gone up following the wage increases.

In preparing for a new round of pay demands, CIO President Philip Murray said yesterday CIO unions will embrace as their "guideline" a survey contending

that present industry profit levels will permit wages to be raised up to 25 per cent without hiking prices or cutting profits much below wartime peaks.

This survey was made for the CIO by Robert R. Nathan, consulting economist and former planner and war agency official.

Nathan cautioned that unless wages are increased promptly or prices reduced sharply, lagging purchasing power on the part of workers may plunge the nation into a depression.

The Nathan report drew the attention from Walter B. Waisenberg, executive vice president of the National Association of Manufacturers, that it means "an invitation for a new round of wage demands, possibly followed by another series of serious strikes."

A similar reaction came from George Romney, general manager of the Automobile Manufacturers association.

"General profit forecasts, such as that just released by the CIO," Romney declared in a statement, "obscure genuine collective bargaining and promote the type of industrial strife which similar reports generated a year ago."

"Such national forecasting completely disregards the fact that, in our profit and loss economy, even in the most prosperous times, many firms and even whole industries are losing money."

Transportation News

Plans are now under way for the arrival of the Shasta Daylight, a new streamlined limited to be put on the Southern Pacific rails through Klamath Falls some time next spring.

The new train is expected to be much like the now famous Coast Daylight running through Medford, according to L. S. Stitt, passenger agent.

Because of the speed of the new trains it has been found necessary to rebalast the entire stretch of roadbed between Portland and Oakland, Stitt said. Rock and gravel for the job in the Portland-Shasta division is being provided by the local firm

of Gladney and Adams from their plant at Howard Bay. From the bay the rock is shipped across Upper Klamath lake by barge to Modoc Point where it is loaded on cars, bound for various spots on the line. A. L. Gladney of the firm explained that the roadbed is ballasted at present with cinders, which with the increased speed of the new train would blow off in a short time, therefore the heavier ballast is required.

New express rates will become effective at Klamath Falls on December 13, 1946. H. R. Nethercott, agent of the Railway Express agency, announced today. "Based on a recent decision of the interstate commerce commission, the new rates represent increases which, it is hoped, will permit the express agency to meet the higher wage scales which have been in effect since January 1, 1946, increased taxes and to help meet the higher costs

of materials, equipment and rents," Nethercott stated.

New rates will represent an increase of 20 cents per 100 pounds on first class, and 15 cents per 100 pounds on second class rates; with increases in minimum and graduated charges for packages weighing less than 100 pounds. No increase is proposed on rates for daily newspapers, milk and related products.

New tariffs are being distributed to all express offices and the company's 80,000 or more employees are being indoctrinated in the proper and accurate application of the new rates.

Special training bulletins and other publications are being issued to assure that the change from old to new rates will be accomplished without confusion and errors in computation, according to Nethercott.

"It is expected that the additional income to be realized from

the new changes will permit the company to hasten its program of rehabilitating war-worn equipment and will make it possible to quickly restore express service to the high prewar standards," Nethercott concluded.
