In its final report, the 18-member group composed of both democrats and republicans called for "constructive — not punitive" laws to eliminate labor-management disputes and at the same time cautioned against a depression psychology.

Officers Hold Meeting

A group of former wartime officers met last night Wednesday to formulate plans for a Klamath Falls chapter of the Reserve Officers Association.

Present at the meeting was Col. W. H. Sweet, senior instructor of the Oregon military district, who was principal speaker at the affair. Col. Sweet highlighted the need for an organized reserve by pointing out that it was due to the civilian soldier that the United States won the war. He emphasized that the country must continue strong and prepared. In his talk the colonel outlined the structure of the reserve officers corps and the present plans before congress for military preparedness. He stated that America must be prepared to have a fully trained army in the field by M plus 60, or 60 days after the date of mobilization, in any future war crisis.

Two of the officers for the organization were elected at the meeting. Gerald L. (Spec) Murray was elected president and Jack Vaughn was named as secretary-treasurer.

In a statement today Murray stated that there are about 90 former officers in the country, army, navy, marine and coast guard, all of whom may become members of the association. Murray urged that former officers interested in joining should contact him by phoning 7716 or 8802, or Bob Thompson at the Pioneer Tobacco company.

The next meeting of the association is slated for the evening of January 8, 1947, at 7 p. m.

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 12 (AP)—The Shelton, Wash., co-operative sustained yield forest unit—first of its kind in the United States—has been approved and will be established, Regional Forester H. J. Andrews said today.

Andrews said he had been advised from Washington that the chief of the forest service had today signed the agreement which is expected to be effective "almost at once."

The agreement gives the lumber industry in the towns of Shelton and McCleary assurance of a stabilized timber supply for 100 years, he said, since the agreement runs for that time.
