

# Music To Combine Past And Present

The music of the oratorio, "The Divine Mystery," to be presented by Klamath Union high school in the high school auditorium Tuesday and Wednesday, December 17 and 18, is a combination of the great music of the past and the restrained novelty of new numbers composed by Gomer for the oratorio.

The exceptionally beautiful choruses will be sung by the cappella choir of 75 voices, and the mixed chorus of 60 voices, accompanied by Barbara Zinn and Patricia Hunt.

The heaviest assignment in the oratorio is taken by the guest artist Carl Hagel, as the entire narrative is sung. The recitatives, sung by Mr. Hagel, call for all the dramatic expression of which the singing voice is capable. Mr. Hagel has had a great deal of experience in the east and middle west as an oratorio soloist and his part in the production is looked forward to with keen anticipation by the music-loving public.

Doris Weaver is the student soloist, and Gary Rose, boy soprano from Fremont school, sings the boy-soprano solo. Barbara Zinn and Patricia Hunt furnish a two-piano background for the interludes and also accompany the soloists.

The oratorio is of approximately one hour's duration, and a great deal of work by the music, art, drama, and manual arts departments has gone into making it one of the most pretentious and elaborate Christmas concerts attempted by high school students.

The first part of the program is directed by John A. O'Connor, and consists of the "Christmas Fantasia" played by the orchestra and the girls' chorus singing:

"O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," French carol.

"Let Our Gladness Know No End," Bohemian carol.

"Son of Mary," Diack-Boulton.

"Angels We Have Heard on High," French carol.

The girls' chorus consists of 75 voices, the majority of which are freshmen. The orchestra selection is a stirring medley of Christmas tunes cleverly arranged.
