

Left Wing Japs Stage Huge Parade

TOKYO, Dec. 17 (AP)—Left wing organizers staged their largest demonstration in occupied Japan today—a daylong procession estimated by provost marshal at 350,000 to 400,000 shabbily dressed men, women and boys.

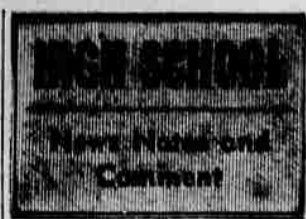
It obviously was intended more to impress General MacArthur with their influence than to accomplish its ostensible purpose, to force Premier Yoshida to resign. As anticipated, the government majority in the house of representatives defeated, 236 to 160, an accompanying resolution to dissolve the diet.

MacArthur himself drove through the crowds of demonstrators at the height of the parade. The marchers readily made room for his well-known black sedan.

Among spectators was Lt. Gen. Kuzma Derevyanko, Soviet member of the four power allied council for Japan. He was afoot and in civilian clothes.

The demonstration was organized openly by communist party leaders and left wingers of the social democratic party. It included communist party cells and numerous labor unions, all identified by flags and banners.

Flight Schools Get Approval

SALEM, Dec. 27 (AP)—The state board of aeronautics announced today it has approved eight schools for additional GI flight training.

They are Grants Pass air service, Newport air service, Earl aircraft of McMinnville, Oregon aircraft of Hillsboro, Shasta-Cascade of Klamath Falls, Sportsman airpark of Newberg, Blue Mountain air service of Pendleton, and Inman Bros. aviation of Astoria. The board adopted standards for approving schools for aircraft and engine mechanics under the state vocational training program, and announced that the Smith-Livingston air service of Corvallis had qualified under the standards.
