

Copco Dam Fish Issue Discussed

Liquor, money distribution and the Copco dam fish issue were touched upon by the Klamath Indians in concluding instructions yesterday to Boyd Jackson and Wade Crawford, the tribal delegates who will go to Washington to appear before the commissioner of Indian affairs and other governmental agencies in connection with Klamath Indian business.

The delegates were instructed to urge passage of the Klamath welfare bill, which would distribute \$1000 per capita to the Indians from reserve funds.

The general council also advised the delegates to work for the enactment of the proposed departmental liquor bill which would eliminate Indian prohibition. Klamath Indians have been on record for some time in favor of removal of the distinction between Indians and whites as regards liquor matters.

The delegates were instructed to "render such cooperation and assistance to the United States government in prosecuting the claims against the California Oregon Power company which claim involves the prevention of salmon and other fish from coming up the Klamath river and entering the Klamath Indian reservation."

Re-opening of the Klamath reservation hospital will be urged by the delegates. The institution has been closed because of lack of personnel, it is understood.

At the suggestion of Delegate Wade Crawford, the council adopted a resolution asking that claims be pressed against William Kittidge, cattlemen, in connection with certain water right matters at the north side of the reservation.

The council took action authorizing Jackson and Crawford to represent members of the tribes, but said they should not take up matters beyond those mentioned by the council and their expenses may be cancelled on non-performance of assignments.

GI Insurance Pay Changes

Veterans residing in this area of Oregon may now pay GI insurance premiums either in person or by mailing to the Medford subregional office of the veterans administration, 33 N. Riverside, Medford, Ore. Emmet F. McGraw, manager, announced today.

Receipts will be issued for premiums paid in person and receipts will be promptly sent to veterans who have mailed their premiums to the Medford veterans administration office. This office will take care of the necessary correspondence with northwest branch insurance headquarters at Seattle, Mr. McGraw stated.

Veterans are cautioned that in all instances they should properly identify themselves either by giving insurance policy number or service serial number.

The new collector is himself a veteran of 27 months in the army and served with the 91st division in Italy. Before joining the veterans administration he worked in the office of the resident engineer at Camp White, Ore.
