

Churchill Lashes At Atlee For 'Breaking Up Empire'

LONDON, Dec. 20 (AP)—Prime Minister Atlee announced today that discussions would be held with Burmese leaders soon to speed Burma's progress toward self-government and Winston Churchill immediately assailed the decision as a step toward dissolution of the British empire.

In a fighting speech in the house of commons cut short by the speaker's ruling that he was out of order, Churchill declared:

"It was said in the days of the great administrator, Lord Chatam, that you had to get up very early in the morning not to miss some acquisition of territory which was then characteristic of our fortunes.
