Famine Relief Drive Slated

Famine conditions in Europe are again being brought to the attention of the congregation of the Klamath Falls Seventh Day Adventist church. All the churches of that denomination in the country are cooperating to raise half a million dollars in a single day, Saturday, December 21, for a famine relief offering. Pastor P. C. Alderson of Klamath Falls announced this week.

A cablegram from W. E. Nelson of Washington, D. C., who is visiting churches in Europe, urges American churches to come to the aid of people in Europe.

Figures to be given to churches Saturday show that the Adventist relief organization has shipped over a million dollars in food to Austria, Hungary, Czechoslovakia and Germany in recent months where they have been effectively distributed, and many letters of appreciation have been received. Of the 800 tons of clothing shipped, 29 barrels have been sent by the Klamath Falls Dorcas society.
