Supersonic Planes Face Heat Problem

BOSTON, Dec. 28 (AP)—New supersonic airplanes flying in the intense cold of the upper atmosphere may need built-in refrigeration to keep the pilots from roasting, Brig. Gen. Malcolm C. Grow said Friday.

The army air forces surgeon explained it is estimated supersonic speeds—above the 750-mile-an-hour level—may generate such heat from air friction against the skin of the airplane that cockpit temperatures will rise to 300 degrees.

 Excavation, 100 cu. yds.
 Concrete including reinforcing steel, 225 cu. yds.
 Metal sheet piling, 1700 lineal feet
 Rock rip rap, 500 square yards
