

Stocks Edge Up Slightly

NEW YORK, Dec. 31 (AP)—In the final session of 1946, stocks generally edged upward today although there was nothing resembling a strong rally and scattered market leaders held to the losing ranks.

The list churned actively at intervals with occasional slow-downs. Gains of fractions to 3 or more points were well distributed around midday. These were reduced here and there near the close. Transfers for the full proceedings of around 1,700,000 shares were among the largest of the past two weeks.

Furniture Plant Destroyed By Oil Fed Blaze

SALEM, Dec. 31 (AP)—A spectacular fire fed by exploding barrels of oil and lacquer destroyed the Reimann furniture manufacturing plant here last night with loss estimated by a company official at \$250,000.

Rich L. Reimann said the damage was partially covered by insurance.

Cause of the blaze was not

determined. Firemen fought the fire with 15 hose lines, preventing its spread to a nearby lumber company and tavern.

Reimann said the plant, employing 80 persons, would be rebuilt immediately.

Matson Withdraws Airline Plan

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 31 (AP)—"Changed circumstances" and lack of assurance of government aid were cited as motivating factors today in the withdrawal by Matson Navigation company of its application for air service be-

tween the Pacific northwest and Hawaii.
