Reed is at her home. She is employed at the Tik-Tok. Exactly 124 cars were checked in at headquarters Sunday, carrying 498 people into the park, most of them for winter sports. The skiing was reported fair with 58 inches of snow covered with a thin, icy crust. Minimum temperature Sunday night was 14 degrees and at 8:30 a. m. today, the temperature was 27. Roads are said to be icy and very slick, with chains advised. The morning radio report gave out.

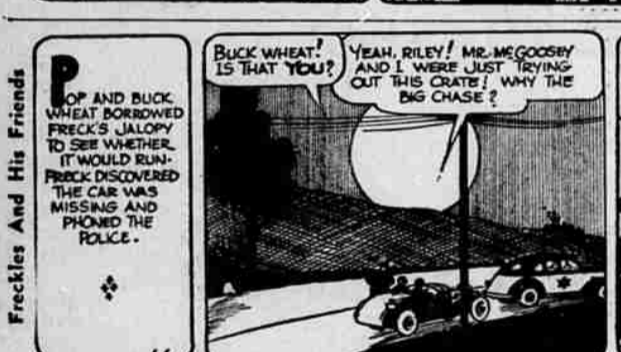
