

SNELL WARNS OF NEW TAX LOAD

More Snow Predicted For Basin

Whipped by a strong north wind, the Klamath basin and surrounding mountain areas felt the lash of winter as snow covered this section of southern Oregon today from a depth of five inches in Klamath Falls to a fall of 28 inches at Crater Lake national park.

Ground transportation continued uninterrupted, however, The Southern Pacific said it was necessary to get out the snow fighting equipment after more than 14 inches fell at Kirk and Crescent Lake. Trains were on time as were Greyhound buses which fought 10 inches of new snow on the Greensprings highway.

Both city and county schools said the buses from outlying districts brought students to classes on time today.
