

"Ghost Town" Tosses Hat In Winter Sports Ring

ASPEN, Colo., Jan. 13 (AP)—This mountain-ringed mining community which once poured wealth in a flood of silver is making a million-dollar gamble to become the winter sports center of America.

Old timers and newcomers alike hope that a surface commodity—snow—will yield more returns in tourist dollars than zinc and silver mines which once made Aspen famous.

How much the Mollie Gibson and other great mines produced in the famous years from 1880 to 1893 is uncertain. Some town historians put it as low as \$40,000,000. Others set the figure as high as \$105,000,000.
