Turkey Recipe Given

With Oregon turkey now available to consumers at lower prices, some might like to make their own smoked turkey, a delicacy that is usually a high-priced gift item on the market," believes Mrs. Winnifred K. Gillen, Klamath county home demonstration agent. Directions for smoking turkeys or chickens, either in natural smoke or by using smoke, are given in an extension mimeographed circular now available at her office, room 208, in the Klamath Falls post office building.
 The process with natural smoke, says Mrs. Gillen, involves soaking the dressed and drawn birds in a salt pickling solution two to four weeks, depending on the size of the birds. When the birds are removed they are washed and hung up to dry and then smoked over hardwood for a period ranging from several hours to several days, depending on the degree of smoked flavor desired.
