Portland, Jan. 20 (AP)—Railroad agreement to ship locomotives destined for Russia across the U. S. via export freight rates will mean marine loading of the cargo here instead of at Atlantic ports, officials said today.

Capt. D. J. McGarity, port director, said 200 locomotives and 50,000 tons of machinery and steel were in prospect for shipment from Portland to the USSR.
