

USBR Office, Staff Move To Airport

The administration, operations and engineering departments of the local office of the bureau of reclamation have moved from the post office building, lock, stock and barrel, to assume new quarters at the airport.

District Engineer Ray Best said today that the district office and the Tulelake homestead unit would remain for the time being in their quarters at the post office, but all other units will be located at the airport. Persons seeking homestead information, he said, could contact the homestead unit in the same office it has always occupied.

Best said that the move was necessitated by the large expansion of the reclamation projects in this area.

"We just outgrew our space at the post office," he said, "and since we own property at the airport anyway we decided to move out there." The land was loaned to the navy by the bureau during the war, it was explained.

The work being done on the proposed boundary dam has increased the bureau's staff considerably, Best said, as have the homestead project and the water survey.

GOP Women Name Officers
