

# Teacher Pay Still Too Low

WASHINGTON, Jan. 23 (AP)—An official of the National Education association said salary increases granted teachers during 1946 "are being cancelled out by the upward trend in prices," leaving their financial distress as bad as ever.

Willard E. Givens, NEA executive secretary, estimated in a statement that the average salary of teachers, principals and supervisors for the 1945-46 school year was about \$2,000. Saying it is too early to predict what the 1946-47 average salary will be, Givens added:

"Unless the average has advanced by \$300 to \$400, the problem of recruiting and keeping teachers will continue to grow worse, as teachers' salaries continue to drop in purchasing power."
