Residential Track Opened

Yalta Gardens, the new 40-acre residential tract, was officially opened January 15 by Harvey, Martin and E. Gray, realtors.

The tract extends between Shasta way and S. 6th and between Ward and Homedale and commands a view of the town and of Mt. Shasta. It was purchased in 1943 from Dewitt Smith of San Francisco and is the former Walt Smith home-stand.

The name "Yalta Gardens" was suggested by the late C. S. Robertson, president of the First Federal Savings and Loan, when the tract was willed. It was the time of the big three conference at Yalta, and the late President Roosevelt's comment upon his return was that Yalta was such a "beautiful and peaceful place."

Construction on the subdivision was started about 10 months ago. All underground irrigation for the entire tract is now in.
