

Threat Of Heavy Freeze May Send Byrd Party Back

ABOARD USS MT. OLYMPIUS, Little America, Jan. 23 (Delayed AP)—The threat of a sudden, heavy freeze may force the navy's Antarctic expedition to return home weeks earlier than originally planned.

At present, ships in the expedition's central group are anchored in the open water of the Bay of Whales at the edge of the south polar ice cap.

But to the north is the menacing Ross ice pack—bigger than even this year.

World Bank Head Dies

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24 (AP)—The unexpected death of Harold D. Smith, vice president of the World Bank, leaving that global reconstruction agency leaderless again today, presumably will spur the search for a new president.

Smith, former United States budget director, was stricken suddenly by a heart attack late yesterday at his farm home near Culpeper, Va. He was 48 years old.

He had been serving as chief executive of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development since December 18, when President Eugene Meyer resigned. Smith resigned too, but agreed to stay on until the bank's directors elected a new president.

Coincidentally with Smith's death—which came so suddenly that medical aid was not at hand—a bank official indicated privately that the wide-ranging search for a president may be nearing an end. The selection is "under active consideration" at this moment, he told a reporter, and the directors hope for an early decision.

College Shows Enrollment Gain

Final winter term registration figures at Southern Oregon college show that enrollment has increased over the fall term.

Mrs. Winston, the registrar, pointed out that never before in the history of the college has this happened. The usual pattern is for winter enrollments to fall off, she said, and most colleges in the country this year have reported a slight loss in winter enrollment, but at Southern Oregon college there are more students than ever. The total figure reached 524 on the last day of registration. There are 375 men and 149 women. The veterans and non-vets are evenly divided, numbering 262 in each group.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24 (AP)—Eight pickets failed to keep the Truman family and their party from a performance of "Blossom Time" at the National theater last night.

The "committee for racial democracy in the nation's capital" promptly issued a statement declaring Press Secretary Charles Ross and the secret service had sought to "effect the sneak entrance of the president of the United States into a Jim Crow theater."

The pickets, protesting refusal of the National to admit negroes, were herded to one side by police along with others on the sidewalk when the president, Mrs. Truman, their daughter Margaret and a group of her friends arrived.

Without looking at the seven sign-carrying white men and one negro, the Trumans walked in through the main entrance.

Unidentified Flyer Killed When Chute Fails In Plane

SEATTLE, Jan. 24 (AP)—The body of an unidentified army aviator was recovered early today in the crashed wreckage of a C-47 transport plane from which two fellow aviators had bailed out successfully, the King county sheriff's office said.

The flyer's parachute apparently fouled before he could clear the plane, deputies said.

The two-engine plane, bound from Great Falls, Mont., to McChord field, 35 miles south of Seattle, became lost in the murky skies over Seattle and ran out of gas "within three minutes" of Sand Point naval air station. It crashed near midnight on the north shore of Lake Washington.

A Sand Point spokesman said the plane radioed at 10:45 p. m. it was short of fuel. It was flying on one engine when the pilot radioed the crew would bail out. The station was attempting to lead it in by radar but was unable to make contact.

The two aviators who bailed out were 1st Lt. Harold B. Kinison of Charleston, W. Va., and 2nd Lt. M. A. Smith of Clinton, Ky.

The entire city was alerted shortly after the 10:45 message from the plane, when the civil aeronautics authority appealed
