

Officials Attend Meet

Three Klamath county officials, County Judge U. E. Leeder, County Clerk Charles DeLap and Sheriff Lloyd L. Dew, were in Salem yesterday to confer with the Klamath legislative delegation on a boost in salaries for the elected county officials.

Any salary increase would have to be made by act of the legislature, and the amount of the boost sought by the officials has not been disclosed.

However, the present county budget sets aside money for \$600 a year raises for the various elective officers, but the legislature may not authorize that figure. For the past four years these officers have received \$25 a month above their set salaries, by special legislation, but the \$25 raises ended January 1.

Almost every other county in the state is trying to get wage increase measures through the legislature this session.

Judge Hamilton will replace Circuit Judge Charles H. Combs of Lakeview, who was disqualified by the defendant. Judge Combs had been assigned to replace Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg, disqualified by the plaintiff.

No date has been set for a court hearing.

Navy Asks That Allowance Continue

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28 (AP)—The navy asked today that the law providing monthly allowances for families of servicemen be extended at least until July 1, 1949.

The allowances now could cease six months after the end of the war, as declared by congress.

The navy offered a bill to extend the benefits. It also asked that the allowances of men enlisting prior to last July 1 be continued throughout their four-year enlistments.

This is the first annual leaders' conference at Corvallis in the last four years.

Britain Okays Burma Move

LONDON, Jan. 28 (AP)—The British government announced today it had reached an agreement with Burma that will permit the Asiatic crown colony to attain independence.

Lord Pethick-Lawrence, secretary of state for India and Burma, said that an interim government similar to that established for India would administer affairs during the transitory period for the 262,000-square-mile region and its 17,000,000 inhabitants.

Burma lies just east of India. It was a battleground in the war against Japan.

Lord Pethick-Lawrence announced the accord in the house of lords. He said a constituent assembly made up entirely of

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28 (AP)—Meat exports, which were halted during the shortage last summer, will be permitted again.

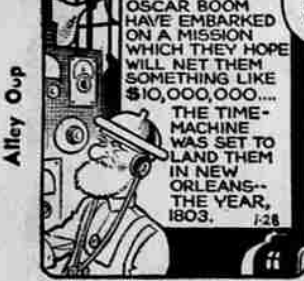
The agriculture department announced today it has allocated

115,000,000 pounds of meat and meat products for commercial exports during the January-March period. Prospective production in the quarter year is more than 6,000,000,000 pounds. Foreign governments wanting the meat will have to buy it themselves through regular commercial channels. Until exports were stopped last year, purchases for export were made by the agriculture department.
