

# Loquacious Leo Levels Verbal Blast At Judge

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 28 (AP)—Leo Durocher, who has done a lot of talking back to umpires as boss of the Brooklyn Dodgers, has picked a new target—the judge who is threatening to set aside the California divorce he granted last week to Movie Actress Laraine Day.

Durocher married Miss Day in El Paso, Tex., shortly after she obtained a divorce from her first husband, a Mexican, in Mexico.

Superior Judge George A. Dockweiler, who a day earlier dissolved Miss Day's marriage to J. Ray Hendricks, airport executive, has summoned her before him next Tuesday to show why he should not rescind the decree.

The loquacious Leo, who all along has been saying only "no comment," finally issued a statement. It was about Judge Dockweiler. He said the judge released to the public the transcript of a conference in his chambers with Laraine and Leo when they flew back from El Paso.

Leo didn't stop there. He said he and Laraine were "legally man and wife and we intend to remain so as long as we live."

"It is a disgraceful situation," the Durocher communique continued. "When a supposedly hollower-than-thou jurist can suggest—as he did to my wife and myself—that we annul our marriage and her Juarez divorce, and that the court would overlook our living in sin until her interlocutory decree becomes final. This, he explained, would be legally permissible."

Judge Dockweiler said this of the boss of "Dem Bums."

"Mr. Durocher isn't a party to the proceedings. He is at liberty to entertain any opinion he desires regarding my ability. I don't propose to engage in any discussion with him on the proprieties of the matter now pending. He's an interloper."

"I did not release the transcript to the press, but it was in no way private or unprivileged. Miss Day's lawyer started off with: 'This is for the record, Judge.'

Judge Dockweiler said he didn't tell Laraine and Leo he would overlook their "living in sin" until her California interlocutory decree became final. He said he told them many couples violated the law in that regard and that he could not police the situation.

# Stockman Has Full Time Job

WASHINGTON, Jan. 29 (AP)—Towering Rep. Lowell Stockman (R-Ore.) is finding that membership on the house appropriations committee is a man's size job.

Stockman is serving on the subcommittee considering the interior department appropriation bill which includes funds for all of the reclamation, irrigation, Indian service and other activities of the department. The committee meets twice a day, five days—sometimes six days—a week trying to get the bill to the floor of the house by the middle of February.

The group usually meets from 10 a. m. until noon and from 2 p. m. until dark. Stockman says that between sessions he doesn't have time to do much except sign his mail.

Stockman is the only member from the far west on the subcommittee, which is composed mostly of midwesterners and southerners who are not familiar with the reclamation problems of the west.

DACHAU, Germany, Jan. 29 (AP)—An American military court today sentenced to death by hanging three Germans who admitted to the witness stand that they shot five American fliers in the back while the airmen were being marched ahead of them as prisoners of war.

The Germans, Gustav Stork, Gustav Deppe and Franz Durshcke—two former policemen and a chimney sweep—said they shot the Americans in August, 1944, on order from a rural district police chief.
