Barron Heads Fire Protection

ALTURAS, Feb. 1—Mel Barron, former forest supervisor, now superintendent of the Goose Lake Box company in this district, was elected chairman of the newly formed fire protection board at a meeting held here in the forest office.

The board consists of one member each from Modoc natural resources council, county supervisors, lumber industry and the Modoc County chamber of commerce.

The board will work in cooperation with the forest service in promoting forest fire protection. It will also try to work out some plan for fire protection in areas outside the forest boundaries.

It was pointed out that ranchmen in the hills throughout the county who have thousands of dollars invested in buildings, hay stacks, etc., have no fire protection whatever.

Permit Total Hits \$23,985

The 38 building permits issued by the Klamath Falls city building inspector for January, 1947, were valued at \$23,985. This is \$45,841 less than the total of the 20 permits issued in January, 1946, valued at \$69,826.

Fees for January permits amounted to \$92 in comparison to \$150 in fees for permits January, 1946.

The 38 permits were issued for work on two new residences at \$11,000, three new private garages at \$900, remodeling 11 business buildings at \$4,900, remodeling 14 residences, \$5,925; remodeling five private garages at \$1,010, and erecting three poster panels at \$250.

The permits show very little new building being done this January but Walt Salsbery, city building inspector, predicts a pickup in building about March.
