

Webfoot Grid Future Getting Ray Of Hope

EUGENE, Feb. 5.—The football fortunes of the University of Oregon were beginning to look rosier this week as Jim Aiken, newly-acquired coach from Nevada, began moving around to get acquainted.

Also there came reports that Jake Leicht, speedy halfback with two years varsity experience, will remain at the university campus this fall and compete on collegiate grids.

Previously Jake had announced his intention of quitting school and playing professional football before his earning days on the gridiron were over. He has a wife and child to support.

The elusive ball-carrier, who was handicapped by injuries last fall and consequently couldn't pack much of a lead for the Ducks, is said to have made the decision to stay on the campus after a long conference with Aiken.

The Oregon football staff is nearing completion now with the appointment of Frankie Zazula, former Akron university backfield coach, to a like position in the Webfoot coaching hierarchy.

The announcement was made yesterday by Aiken, who said that Zazula was the best back he ever coached.

Zazula, but recently discharged from the navy, will report March 1 in time to prepare for spring practice.

Aiken said that this third assistant coach would not be named until the conclusion of spring practice.

Aiken is expected to reveal publicly what his plans for the University of Oregon football future are at an alumni and Oregon Duck club banquet in Portland tonight.

Vet's Mail Bag

Veterans in training under the GI bill who receive national guard or naval reserve drill pay need not report such income when filing their report of earnings, says the veterans administration.

Many veterans drawing subsistence while training have been in doubt as to whether such income must be reported and the ruling by Edward E. Odom, solicitor for the VA, clarifies the point. Combined "productive labor" and subsistence cannot exceed the \$175 and \$200 ceilings imposed by congress.

Benefits to World War II Veterans and Their Dependents
Compensation to veterans: Description: \$13.80 to \$138 a month, according to degree of disability. Additional amounts to a maximum of \$360 for specific disabilities.
Requirements: Disease or injuries suffered in, or aggravated by active wartime service, not the result of willful misconduct. Discharge under conditions other than dishonorable.

Question of the Week
Q. I am a World War I veteran in need of hospitalization. How do I go about making application for admittance to a veterans administration hospital?
A. VA form P-10, "Application for Hospital Treatment or Domiciliary Care," should be executed by the veteran or nearest relative, guardian or representative and forwarded to the nearest VA hospital, regional office, or contact office. If found to be eligible for admittance, the veteran will be notified promptly and if admittance cannot be authorized,
