Medford Pears To Be Shipped

Pears for Palestine.

Shipments of D'Anjou pears, grown in Medford, and stored in Klamath Falls at the Klamath Ice and Storage plant, are being sent to such exotic places as Palestine, Syria and Egypt, according to George Myers, manager of the plant. Orange growers in Tel-Aviv will soon be eating the pears which left the basin within the last few weeks.

Myers stated the plant is now handling quite a bit of packaged frozen foods. The cartons are stored in the freezing chambers in transit from Washington and northern Oregon to eastern points.

PENDLETON, Feb. 7 (AP)—Teachers' salaries for the 1947-48 year will be increased to \$2400 minimum in Pendleton.

The school board yesterday voted an average \$300 increase for the instructors. Those with a master's degree and eight years' experience will get a \$3120 maximum. A bonus of \$250 was granted, plus \$60 for each year's service.

WHITEFISH, Mont., Feb. 7 (AP)—Rear Admiral J. L. Holloway Jr., superintendent of the U.
