

Moving SP Dispatcher's Office To Dunsmuir Gets Protest From Local Men

Strong opposition has developed to a proposed plan of the Southern Pacific company to close the Klamath Falls dispatcher's office and move the employees to Dunsmuir.

The men themselves are definitely opposed to the proposal, and the Klamath chamber of commerce has sent a letter to J. W. Corbett, superintendent of transportation for the SP.

The chamber letter said that the proposed move may have resulted from recent decreases in railroad business, but pointed out that there is a large potential in and out of here in the next few months and asked that no action be taken at least before June 30.

Going the SP one better, the chamber letter, signed by President John H. Houston, proposed that the division superintendent's office of the SP be moved to Klamath Falls. It is now located at Dunsmuir.

Safety Council May Be Used

Organization of high school student safety councils has been suggested by Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell Jr., as a means of supplementing class room instruction in driver training.

"Drivers and pedestrians must learn that safety in today's traffic is, to a great degree, a matter of acceptance of individual responsibility for the efficient, comfortable movement of vehicles and walkers," Farrell declared. "One of the best methods of teaching young people these responsibilities is to give them the responsibility for safety in their own environment."

The secretary of state said that his office now is distributing a series of high school safety manuals, designed to help student safety councils organize and conduct traffic accident prevention programs. These manuals give detailed instructions in such fields as accident reporting, analysis and maintenance of accident statistics, traffic engineering surveys, motor vehicle inspection, student traffic courts and other related activities.

Several Oregon high schools now are making plans to organize student safety councils and others interested are urged to contact the traffic safety division, secretary of state's office, Salem, Oregon, for complete information on this subject.

INDISCREET PHRASING?

He told the house yesterday

he is "convinced that this program will solve the critical potato surplus problem and save millions of dollars" annually in government price support payments.

Use of potato flour in bread, cake and other bakery products first was urged by Shafer last month.
