

# Two Bills Introduced To Legislature To Aid In Finding Wheat Markets

SALEM, Feb. 11 (AP)—Two legislative measures to help find markets for expected wheat surpluses won the unanimous approval today of the house agriculture committee.

One is a bill sponsored by the Eastern Oregon Wheat League, to levy a tax of a half cent a bushel to finance an agency to find markets for wheat, particularly to develop new uses. The other is a memorial asking congress to appropriate funds under the Hope-Flannagan act, which would provide for marketing and production research.

The federal Hope-Flannagan act provides for grants to states for marketing research, but the state would have to match fed-

# Youth Quizzed In Shooting

HILLSBORO, Ore., Feb. 11 (AP)—District Attorney G. H. Morgan reported today that Washington county authorities were questioning 16-year-old Albert Jack Green of Lake Grove in the gun slaying and robbery of Ralph Porritt, 49, The Vancouver, Wash., salesman's bullet-riddled body was found Friday along a rural road near the boy's home.

Morgan said Green was arrested by Clackamas County Deputy Gordon Clinefelter last night and had confessed the slaying.

At Oregon City, Chief Deputy E. L. Bacon reported the youth told of quarreling with his foster parents, Mr. and Mrs. Paul Green and of desperately needing money.

Bacon said the boy told him he came upon Porritt sleeping in his car and "just shot him" with the .22 caliber rifle owned by his foster father.

Bacon said young Green told him Porritt raised up when the first shot struck his neck and he pumped four more bullets into his head, then reached into the man's clothes for his wallet and dragged him from the car. He said he got \$12.

The shooting was less than two blocks from Green's home.
